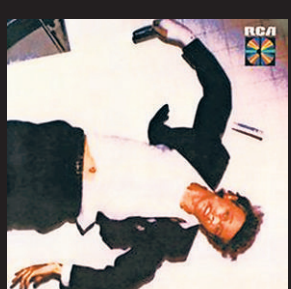
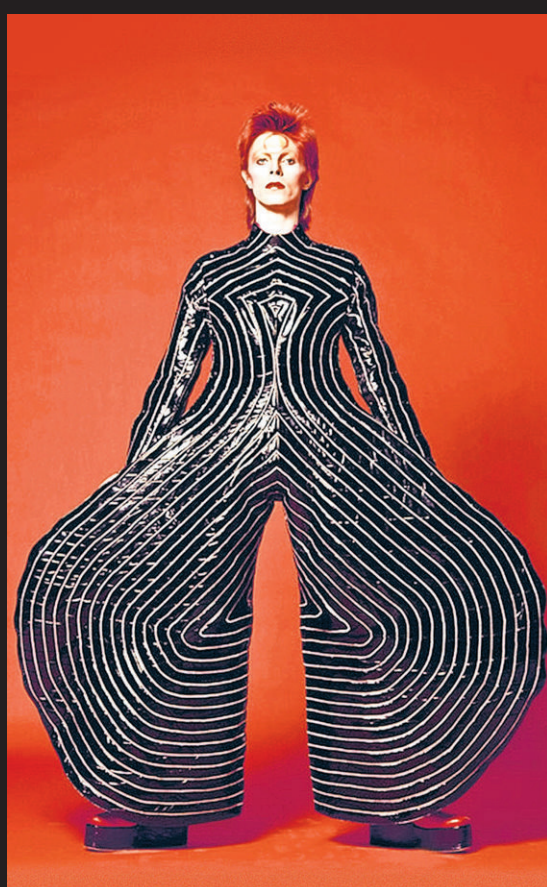


BLACKSTAR (2016)

From Ziggy Stardust to the Thin White Duke and Aladdin Sane, David Bowie, who died on Sunday from cancer, was rock's definitive chameleon.

A master of reinvention whose career spanned two generations, he dazzled millions with his taste for experiment, taking on everything from glam rock and soul to electronica and punk. He marked his 69th birthday by releasing the jazz-inspired Blackstar, hailed by many as one of his most innovative yet.

Here is a look at his studio albums released in Britain, in chronological order, clockwise from top right.



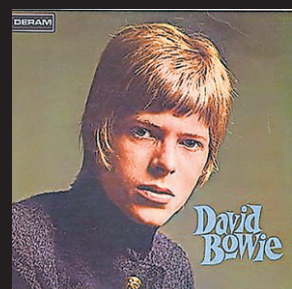

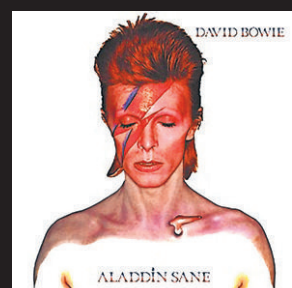
